Dear Praying Friends,

Fifteen years ago, we went on deputation and raised support to come to the Pacific Northwest and plant a church that plants churches. It took us about two years to garner enough support and make the move across the United States. When we first came out, we went to help in a fledgling work that had been started in Central Oregon. Many new foreign missionaries do the same thing, and it made sense to us that we would benefit from working with another church planter before attempting it ourselves. The years we spent helping in that work proved to be invaluable and gave us experience, time to pray, and an opportunity to plan for the work that God would eventually call us to. Seven years ago, God moved us to the state of Washington with the intention of planting a church that plants churches, and we did. After spending a year praying and acclimating ourselves to Washington, we were sent out of Faith Baptist Church in Spokane (Pastor Greg Boyle) to start Liberty Lake Baptist Church in Liberty Lake, Washington. This past September we celebrated the sixth anniversary of Liberty Lake Baptist Church.

From the very beginning, we intended for Liberty Lake Baptist Church to be a church that plants churches, a launching pad from which to start new churches in the Pacific Northwest. We also intended for Liberty Lake Baptist Church to take sole responsibility for that ministry. A step toward that goal required that Liberty Lake Baptist Church take responsibility for all of the financial needs of the church including our family's needs. At a recently held church administrative meeting, Liberty Lake Baptist Church agreed to do that. Therefore, we will no longer require your financial support. By the time you receive this letter, Liberty Lake Baptist Church will have begun to take care of all our financial needs. By faith, we are trusting God for His provision. We still covet your prayers.

Fifteen years ago, we anticipated the time when we would be able to write this letter. If memory serves correct, we did our best to communicate that we did not intend to receive financial support indefinitely. You all have been so faithful over the years, and we are eternally grateful. There is no way that we could have accomplished what we have engaged to accomplish without the faithful prayers and financial investment of people like you.

Thank you for the eternal investment you have made in the Pacific Northwest. Souls have been saved, lives have been changed, families have been salvaged, and revival is stirring. Your labor, sacrifice, and generosity has not been in vain.
